2022 Overview

Farina Farrier (Head of ON, ENA) presented a summary of Open Networks and the objectives of the programme in 2022, followed by Sotiris Georgiopoulos (ON Steering Group Chair, UKPN) who presented an overview of the 2022 areas of work.

Feedback	Response
Members of the Challenge Group are interested in a number of areas beyond the flexibility workstream (such as connections) as these are important topics and they enable the provision of flexibility.	Agreed. ENA will send a request out to the Challenge Group members to understand their areas of interest. Based on this, ENA will bring a proposal for discussion to the next meeting on 5 th May. It was noted that whilst we will try our best to accommodate all topics, we may be limited by time
	available on the agenda and there may be a need for the Challenge Group to agree areas of priority.

Terms of Reference (ToR)

Maxine Frerk summarised key points from the Challenge Group Terms of Reference and invited feedback from the group on ways of working.

Maxine also discussed that following the closing date of the call for participation to join this group last year, we are still receiving several requests from stakeholders to join the Challenge Group to represent categories that already have representatives. Maxine proposed to the group that we formalise the process for reviewing any



new applications in the Terms of Reference and proposed 6-monthly reviews of membership in 2022, followed by annual reviews the year after. There were no objections from the group to this approach.

As part of the discussions, ENA confirmed that the intention remains to be transparent and to publish the materials, minutes, and the Challenge Log on the ENA website. As Ofgem and BEIS are represented on the Open Networks Steering Group, they will be made aware of the feedback from the Challenge Group. As the Chair of this forum, Maxine attends the Steering Group to represent the views of this forum.

2022 Work plan & Areas for Challenge Group input

Ben Godfrey (Chair of ON Flexibility Workstream, WPD) and Andy Wainwright (ON ESO Lead, NG ESO) presented an overview of the objectives of the Flexibility workstream followed by summaries of the specific 2022 flexibility products.

It was recognised by the group that there has been substantial stakeholder and consultation to inform the work plan and priorities that have been set for 2022. The aim of this session was to get feedback from the Challenge





Group to better understand areas of interest to them and how they would like to engage and provide input to shape future sessions.

Feedback	Response
Work on settlement should take account of peer-to-peer trading.	Open Networks will feed this back to the product team to take this into account in their ongoing work.
As part of the work on Carbon Reporting, Open Networks should consider how it will facilitate the reporting of DNO energy efficiency measures. As part of incorporating this, there will also be a need to link in with the newly formed BEIS Reduced Electricity Demand incentive (REDi) Working Group that has recently kicked off to design energy efficiency policy.	Open Networks is in discussion with Ofgem on how energy efficiency is incorporated into this work. We will discuss this within the product team to consider how we could incorporate this into the scope. Open Networks technical lead Avi Aithal currently sits in the REDi Working Group and will feedback learnings from the Working Group to Open Networks.
